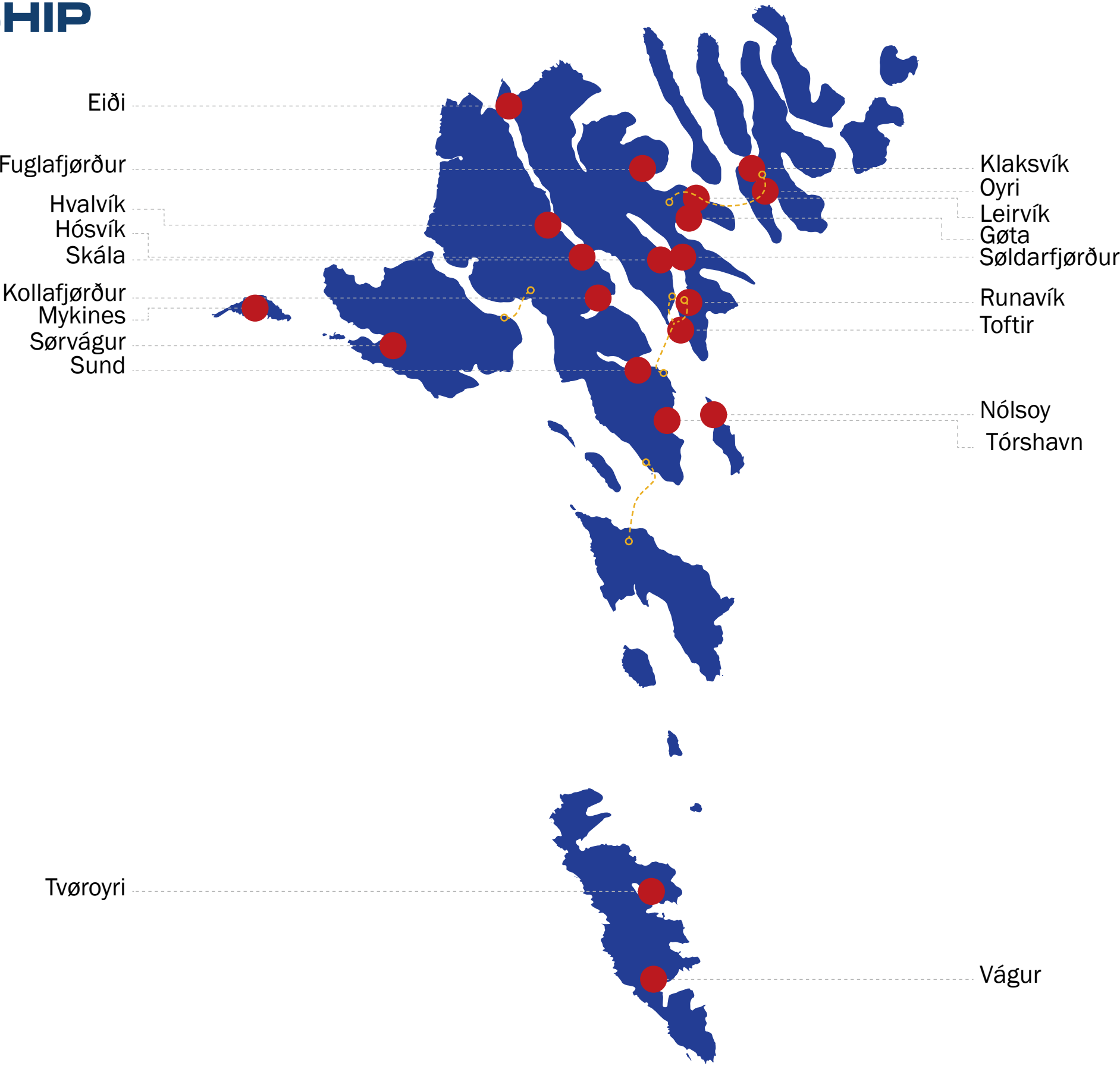

What is new?

- The sub-sea tunnel between Streymoy and Eysturoy finished in early 2021, the first sub-sea tunnel to have a round about and artistic lightning and sculptures, and another tunnel to Sandoy is planned to be finished in 2023. The tunnels will make travelling easier within and between these two biggest islands of Faroe Islands. After the sub-sea tunnel to Sandoy is finished they will start on preparing a sub-sea tunnel from Sandoy to Suðuroy, which will connect all islands in Faroe Islands. It's expected to be finished as soon as 2030.
- Hotel Hilton Garden Inn and Hotel Brandan are our new hotels in Torshavn. With these new hotels and also the expansion of Hotel Føroyar we can expect a lot more tourists in Faroe Islands. A major problem in the past has been the lack of rooms during the high season.
- Expansion in the port of Tórshavn will be finalized in the end of summer season in 2022. With the expansion, the Port of Torshavn will add almost 900 metres of quaysides with a depth of 15 meters.

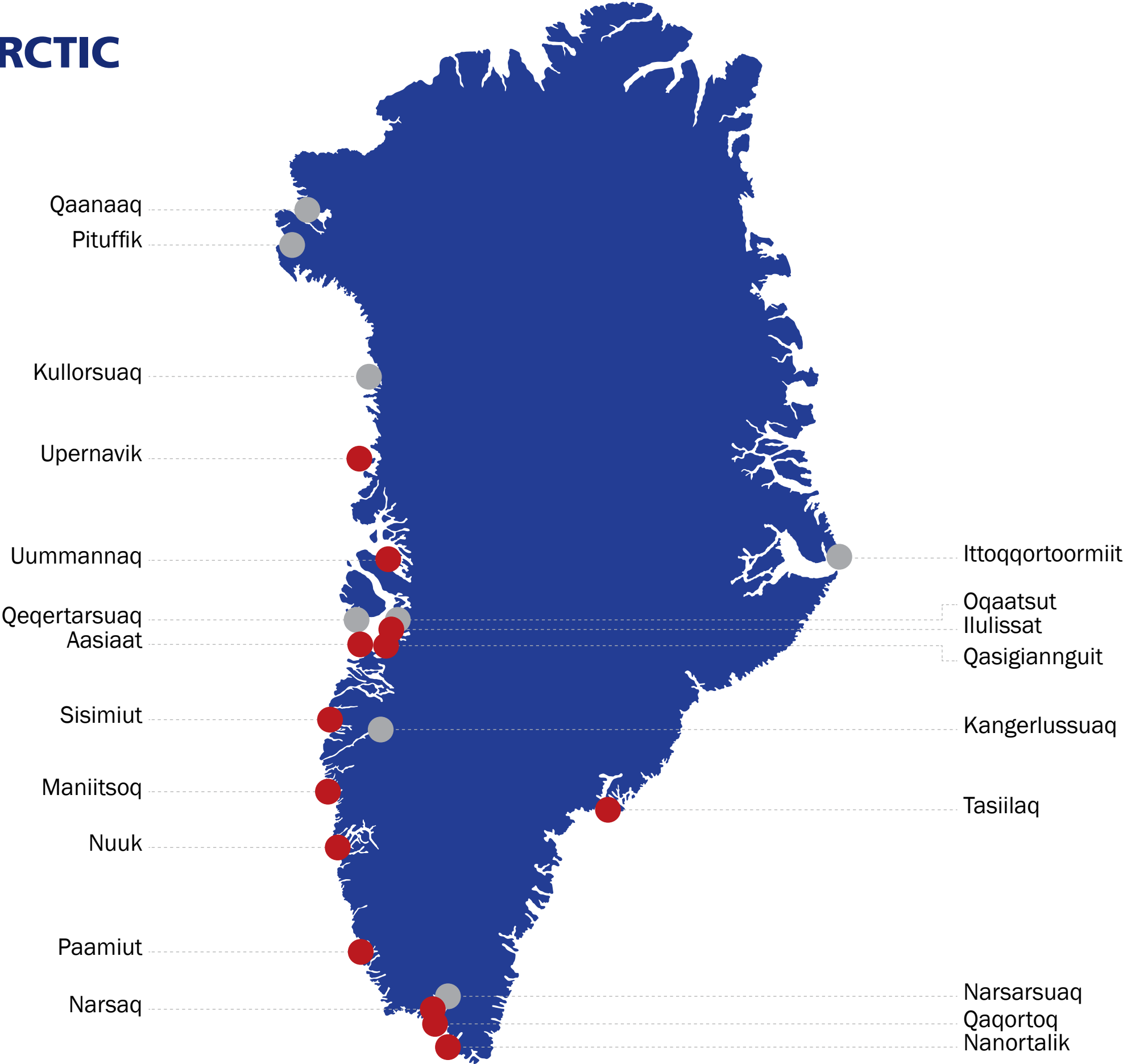

What is new?

- The expansion of airports in Nuuk and Ilulissat is well under way. In the future, they will be the place for pax & crew change. Nuuk airport is scheduled to be completed by the end of 2024 & Ilulissat airport is scheduled to be completed by the end of 2023
- Ilulissat Icefjord Centre opened its doors for guests for the first time in July 2021. Inside the centre guests are taken on a journey through time in the exhibition "Sermeq pillugu Oqaluttuaq – The Story of the Ice", which has been designed by the award winning JAC studios. In the exhibition you pass through a landscape of snowflakes, where archeological artifacts are presented in prisms of glass.

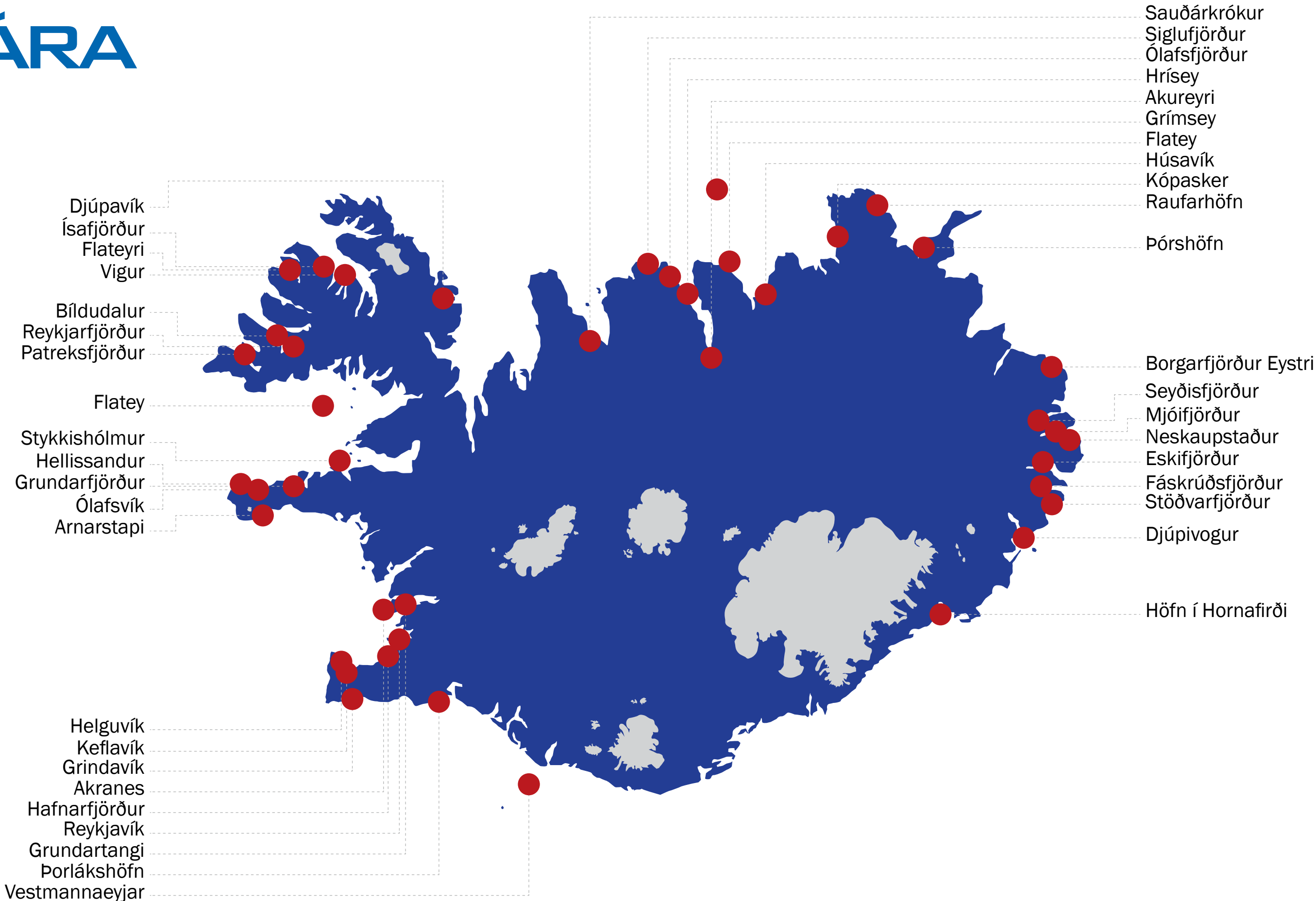

What is new?

- Stricter immigration protocols for 2022. All immigration process will happen face to face in the future in accordance with Schengen Borders Code (SBC). In 2023 immigration will begin to use the Entry Exit System (EES).
- Improved turnaround facilities in port of Reykjavik include a 1000 m² tent for luggage handling including scanning equipments and 13000 m² passenger terminal at Skarfabakki pier 312. And a 300 m² tent at Skarfabakki 315. This will add a cost of 18 USD per passenger using these facilities for turnaround operations.
- Ísafjörður invests in a 300 m extension of Sundabakki with a 10 m draft and no restrictions. The construction is aimed to be finished by the end of June, this year.

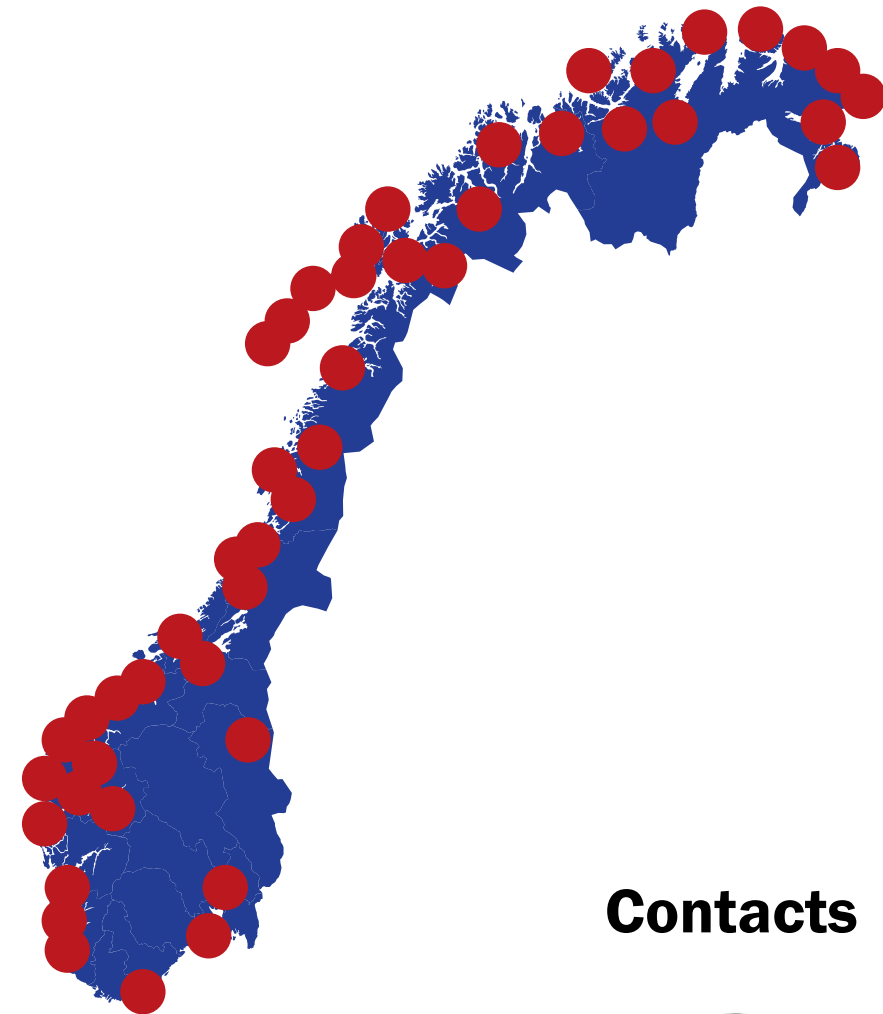

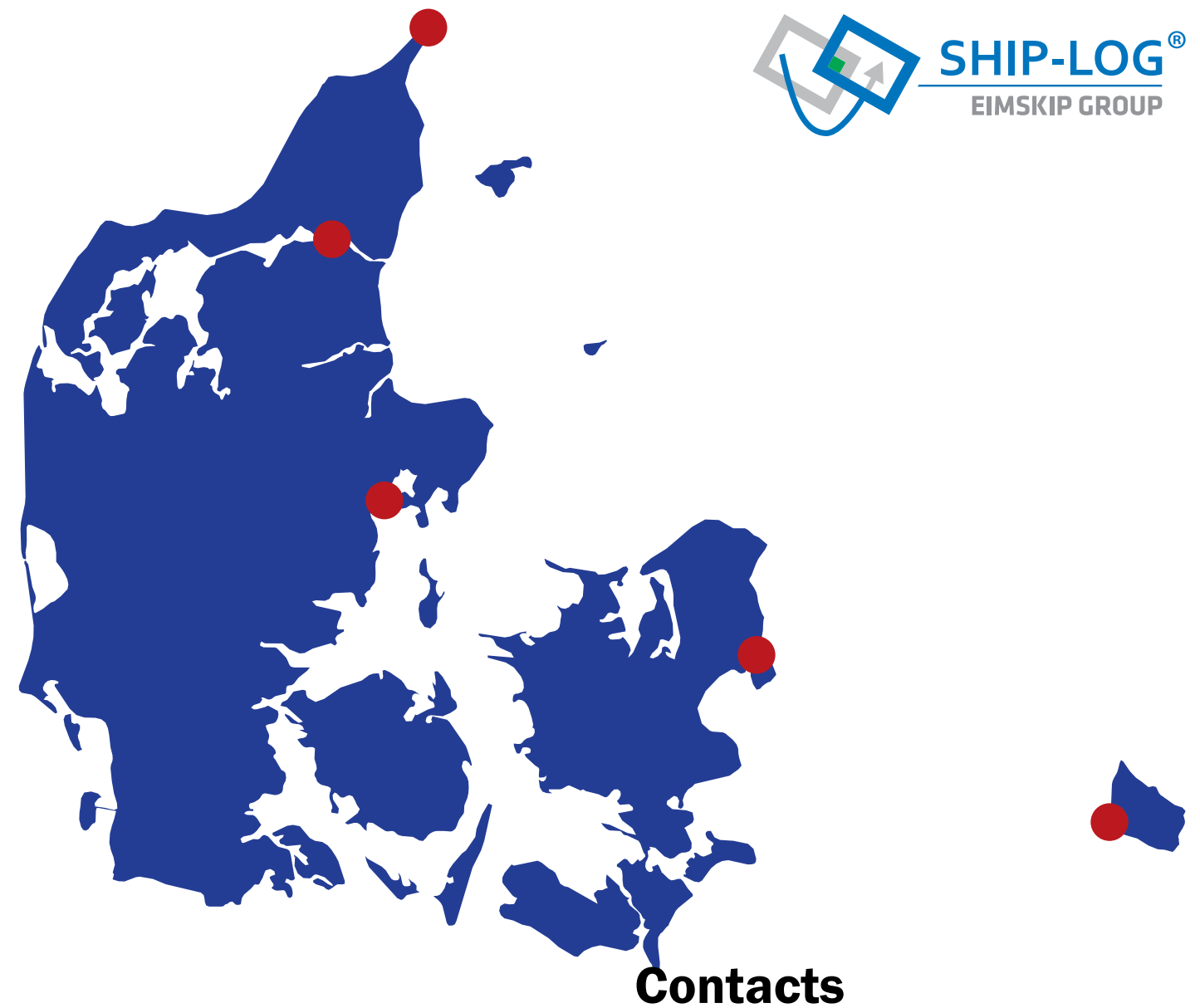

- From January 1st 2020 Iceland introduced a restriction of Sulphur within 12 miles zone around to 0.1%.
- Skeljungur offers fuel lubrication and operational production to vessels in major ports in Iceland.

- Due to increased traffic in Reykjavik we recommend pre booking the oil barge. Further information can be found at www.bunkering.is.

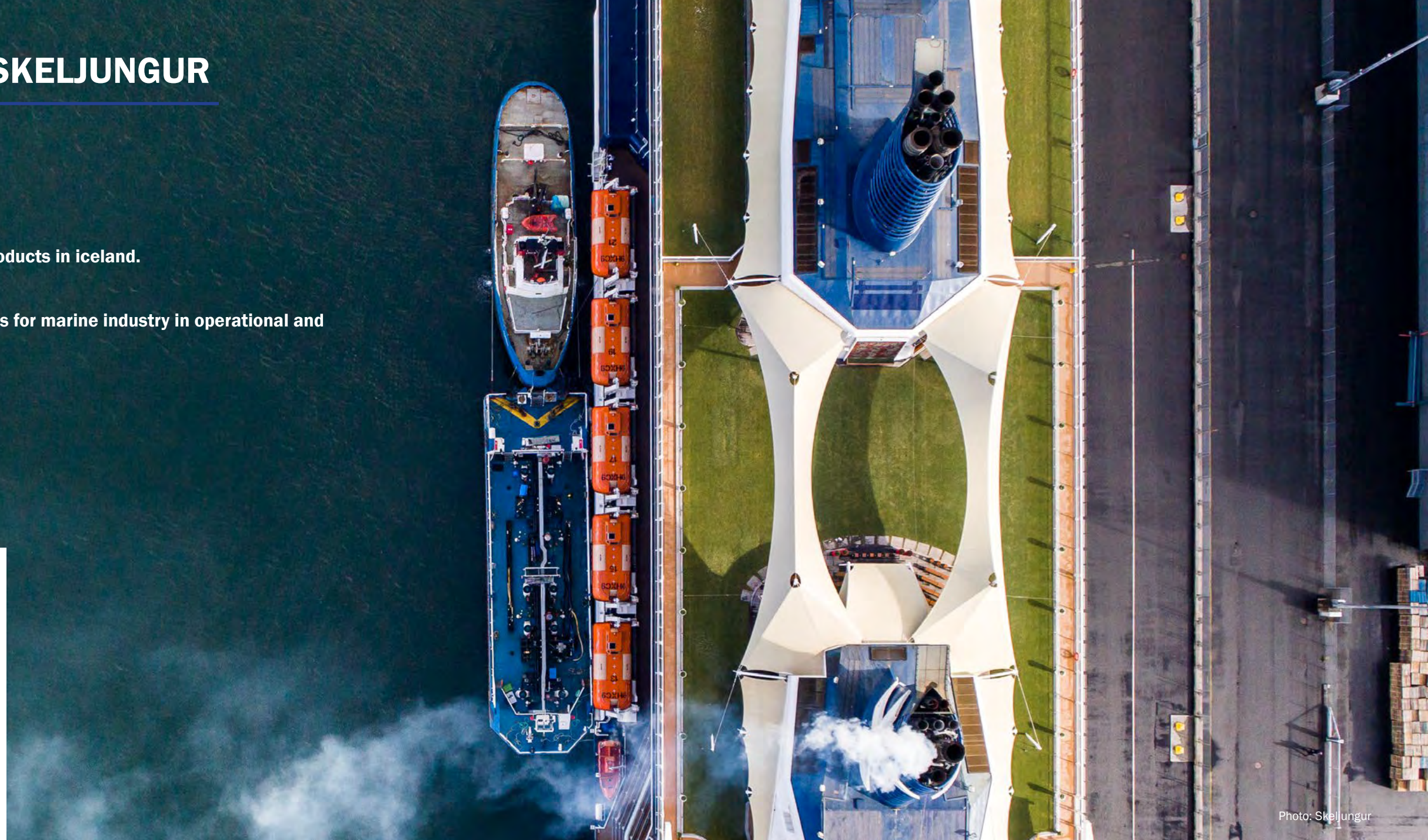

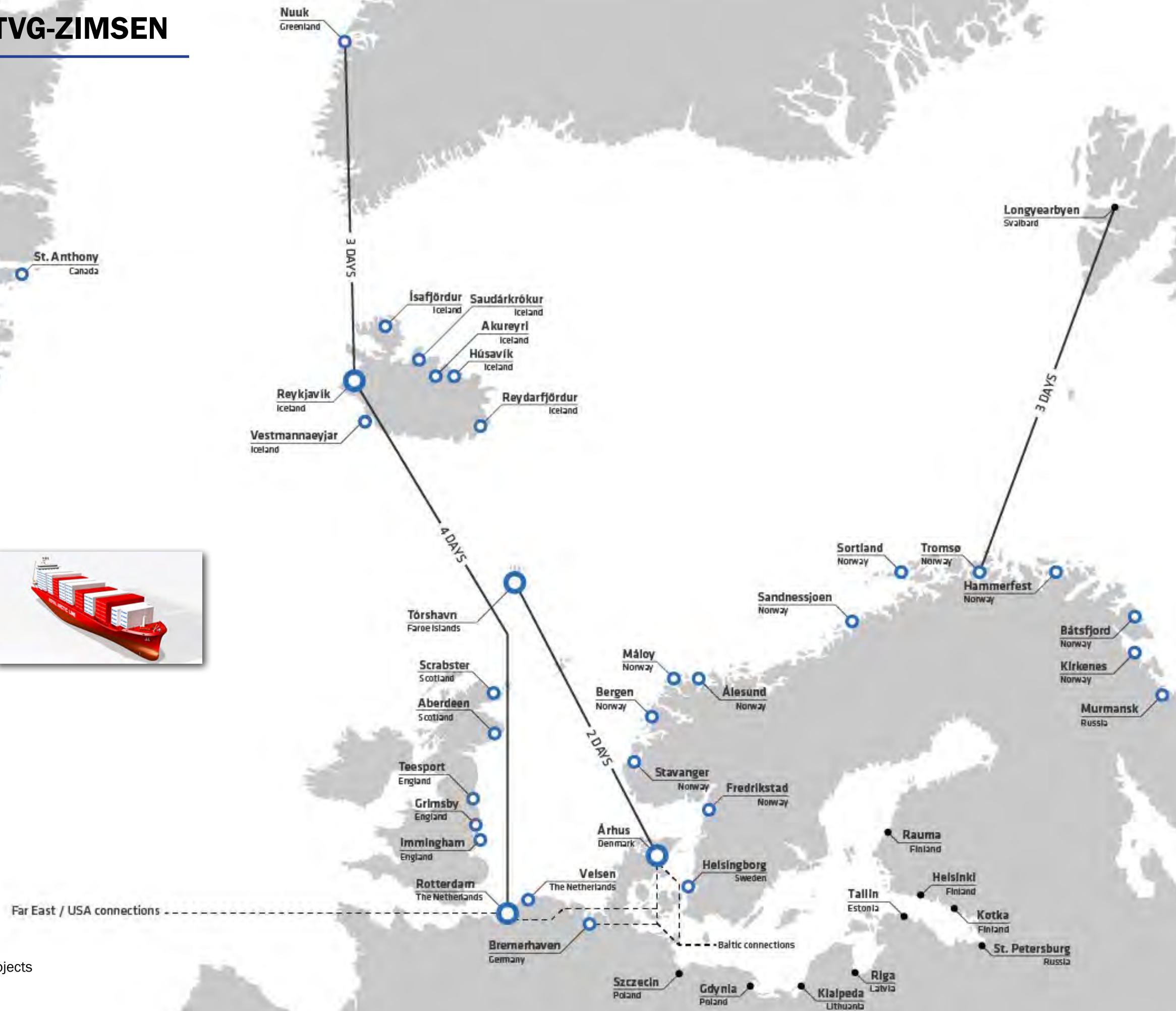

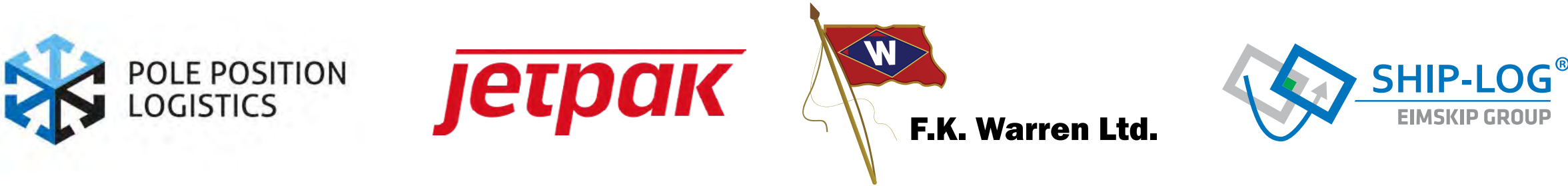
